Camp Triumph Camper Code of Conduct

Camp Triumph has a commitment to providing a valuable, meaningful, and enriching camping experience for all our campers. To assist us in offering the best camp experience we possibly can, please abide by the following camper code of conduct. In order to offer our camps, we must maintain a safe and nurturing environment for everyone.

Respect yourself. Campers are expected, in accordance with their age, to take appropriate care of themselves by maintaining personal hygiene, getting sufficient sleep, dressing appropriately, eating properly, wearing sunscreen, and not taking unnecessary risks.

Respect the environment. Camp Triumph has worked very hard to build and maintain its facility and equipment. It exists for campers to help make the camping experience wonderful. Take care of the facility and equipment. **Respect others**. Camp Triumph expects campers to treat one another, our staff, and visitors with courtesy and respect at all times.

If any camper behaves in a way which compromises our ability to foster a sense of respect and preserve the dignity of every person at camp (campers and staff alike), then it must be understood they will be dealt with as described below.

Rules of Conduct

Any camper that breaks any of the following rules, will be sent home immediately.

- Smoking, alcohol, and illicit drugs are strictly prohibited at Camp Triumph. Campers may not have any cigarettes, drugs or alcoholic beverages in their possession.
- Weapons or any implement that our staff deem dangerous or potentially dangerous are strictly prohibited.

Any camper that breaks any of the following rules MAY be sent home or disciplined based on the seriousness of the offence and the discretion of the directors.

- Inappropriate behaviour, such as bullying, teasing, swearing, verbal harassment, physical harassment, acts of aggression, pranks, practical jokes or disrespect for other people or the environment are not tolerated at Camp Triumph. What may seem harmless to you may have lasting emotional or physical consequences for others.
- Possession and use of cell phones by campers at camp is prohibited.
- Stealing or borrowing other people's possessions without their consent will not be tolerated.
- Vandalizing or damage to camp property and equipment (and Cabot Beach Provincial Park Property) is a serious offence and will not be tolerated. This includes any damage to cabins, bunks, window screens, doors, washrooms, dining hall, any other buildings, signs, program equipment, and the natural environment. You will be held responsible for the cost of repair or replacement, including labour costs.
- We all have great pride in our facility and property. We have a shared responsibility to maintain it. Defacing camp property in any way is also considered a serious offence. Any graffiti including writing, drawing, carving or painting names/pictures etc. on bunk beds, furniture, walls, cabins, washrooms, the lodge, or any other buildings will not be tolerated. You will be held responsible for cleanup, repair or replacement.
- Tampering with any safety devices including smoke alarms and fire extinguishers is a serious offence and will not be tolerated.
- Campers must remain inside our designated boundary (this will be explained to campers during their tour of our facilities).
- Male and female campers may not visit each other's cabins at any time. Campers should only be in his/her cabin when instructed to be (i.e. to change between activities/meals and to sleep).
- Campers must stay in their cabins after lights out at night, except if a washroom trip is necessary.
